Dear Friends

We've entered the first few months of our experiment in being the Church of Scotland, 21st century 'radical plan'-style (although I don't think 'radical' is an apt description of a re-organisation that's been so obviously rooted in financial projections). People have been working very hard on making the transition as smooth as possible, and there is still a huge amount of work to be done. I'm grateful to everyone who has turned up to worship and tried to build connections with people from 'the other congregations', and for all who can't go to worship but who have given prayer and support in other ways during this uncertain time. Things are gradually taking shape. We are no longer St Margaret's, Leith St Andrew's or Pilrig St Paul's but, in genuine and often sacrificial ways, are becoming Leith & Restalrig Church.

I've appreciated your support and your patience as I know it's difficult to get used to new ways of doing things, and this is not how the church normally goes about change. Nothing is normal at the moment. I do think we soon will need to look ahead and consider how we can best grow our congregation in numbers, and reach younger people, without selling out our integrity and without doing what's populist rather than right. It's never going to be an easy task, but we all have a role to play in it. The more people get involved, the more chance we have of success.

Over the next few months, we'll hopefully employ a new Youth & Families Worker and close the search for a second minister to work here. That will make a huge difference and will enable us both to

start using the Leith Walk building more to its potential, and to bring the good news of Jesus in word and action among people in our large parish. John Bell once remarked that faith isn't primarily measured by what we've done in the past – it's always the next step into an unknown future. With faith – even faith as small as a mustard seed – we can bring something positive into the world together.

INTRODUCING THE INTERIM MODERATOR

Until 2024 Leith St Andrew's, Pilrig St Paul's and St Margaret's were served by three parish ministers. Leith & Restalrig Church will eventually have two ministers, plus a Mission & Development Staff worker. The second minister will share the ministerial work with the Rev Rob Mackenzie.

The congregation will soon need to choose names to serve on a Nominating Committee for the second minster – including advertising and interviewing. There are still some administrative tasks to work through before we reach this stage, but hopefully the Nominating Committee will be at work within the next few months and a new, second minister in post later this year.

Another minister is always appointed to serve as "Interim Moderator" in the case of ministerial vacancies, with responsibility to oversee the progress of the vacancy and support the Nominating Committee as appropriate. The Presbytery of Edinburgh & West Lothian has appointed the Rev Matthew Ross to be Interim Moderator for this vacancy. He also served as Interim Moderator at Pilrig St Paul's after the Rev Mark Foster moved to Pitlochry last autumn. At meetings of the Kirk Session, Mr Ross moderates any business relating to the vacancy, whilst the Rev Rob Mackenzie moderates all other items.

Mr Ross is current locum minister at Edinburgh Pentlands Parish Church (a recent union of Colinton and Juniper Green). In 2023, he returned from working in Geneva with the World Council of Churches. He has also worked recently part-time for the University of Glasgow in the School of Critical Studies / Theology & Religious Studies. He studied Divinity at New College, University of Edinburgh, has a Law degree from the University of Edinburgh and a postgraduate Master of Theology degree from the University of Glasgow.

He was ordained as a Church of Scotland minister in 1998. Following 18 months as a probationer at Duddingston Kirk in Edinburgh, his first ministerial charge was Ceres & Springfield Parish Church, near Cupar in Fife, from 1998 until 2003. He then moved to Brussels to work with the Conference of European Churches. In 2009 he returned to Scotland, becoming minister at Cockpen & Carrington linked with Lasswade & Rosewell in Midlothian. In 2014 he was appointed as General Secretary of Action of Churches Together in Scotland, then moved to Geneva in 2018 to work with the World Council of Churches. He has also served as acting Depute Clerk to the General Assembly of the Church of Scotland in 2002-03, was Moderator of the Church of Scotland's Presbytery of Europe in 2009 and has been a member of several boards and committees of the Church of Scotland.

His work on *diakonia* (church-related social care) with the World Council of Churches has given him an international insight into issues of peace, justice, reconciliation and the continuing need to tackle issues such as poverty and access to health, food and clean water. He has written and/or edited several books and publications for the World Council of Churches, including the WCC's major study document "Called to Transformation: Ecumenical Diakonia".

LARCH Teams

Over the past few weeks, we have been aiming to establish various Teams to take forward the work of the Church. We are encouraging as many members as possible to take on an active role within one (or more) teams. You can do as little or as much as you like – any help would be greatly appreciated.

Pastoral Care Team

In its simplest terms, pastoral care is caring for people in the congregation.

If you visit someone at home or in hospital, or phone them from time to time, that's pastoral care.

If you deliver flowers, magazines or Christmas gifts, that's pastoral care.

If you volunteer at the Open Doorway in LARCH Leith Walk, with the Care Van or at Meet, Eat and Play at Craigentinny Primary, that's pastoral care.

If you are already doing any of these things, or would like to get involved in any way, please let us know.

This is a great way of becoming more actively involved in spreading God's love within our community.

Worship Team

This team helps support the Minister with worship activities – this might include:

- Providing cover during the Minister's absence
- Taking part in services readings, sketches, prayers, choir/musical items
- Helping with additional worship events (Christmas, Holy Week, bereavement, Remembrance)
- Helping with Sunday School/Creche
- Supporting the minister with Bible Studies

Comms Team

- This team is responsible for communication, both within the congregation itself, and to the wider community. Its remit includes:
- Keeping the website and Facebook pages up-to-date
- Gathering articles for the Church Magazine and ensuring its distribution
- Producing and distributing posters as and when required
- Overseeing the email and digital storage systems
- Helping with the audio-visual provision in church (PowerPoints, sound, streaming services)

Fellowship Team

This team is responsible for coordinating shared activities within the congregation to help us get to know one another better and to have a good time. This might include:

- Helping with tea and coffee after services
- Helping at the Christmas Fayre
- Helping at other social events

As well as volunteering to help with the work of these teams, we are still looking for people who are keen to help coordinate and organise the work of these teams. Please also let us know if you would be interested in doing this.

Volunteering vs Coordinating?

Just to be clear, we are looking for people to do either (or both). For example, you may be happy to **volunteer** to do a reading at a Sunday service, but don't want to be involved in **coordinating** the

work of the team, such as drawing up rotas. That's absolutely fine. When you sign up, please let us know exactly what you would like to do.

Of course, you may already be involved in one or more of these teams. We do not wish to make any assumptions about you wishing to continue, so it would be really useful if you could also sign-up to show that you wish to continue being involved.

LEITH AND RESTALRIG CHURCH - KIRK SESSION

As you can imagine, the start of a new congregation has meant a busy time for our Kirk Session. Prior to the union, it was decided that the Session would initially be made up of twelve elders, four from each of the former congregations, plus the Minister. The twelve elders are: Jean Aldred, Joanne Baird, Tracy Coyle, Maria Croall, Alex Dickson, Shaurna Dickson, Edmund Farrow, Ginny Gardner, John Innes, Stuart Lithgow, Shona Skakle and Mark Wexelstein.

We held our first meeting on 6 January 2025 and hit the ground running. The following key items were covered:

- The appointment of the Session Clerk (Stuart Lithgow), Depute Session Clerk (Shona Skakle), Treasurer (Mark Wexelstein), Roll Keeper (Jean Aldred), Safeguarding Co-ordinator (Catriona Blackwood), Property Convener (Alex Dickson) and Organist (Stuart Haigh).
- The Property Team was formed, with members from all three former congregations.
- Matthew Ross (Interim Moderator for the second Ministerial post) outlined his role and the steps that would have to be taken to appoint a second minister. He aimed to have the position filled this year.
- The MDS advert was shared and agreed. The MDS post is for a Children, Youth and Family Worker on a 0.5 FTE basis to develop our objectives on reaching out to young people in our community and finding new and innovative forms of worship and ministry relevant to 21st century life.
- We discussed the establishment of a Pastoral Care Team and agreed the model that would be used to ensure the Pastoral Care needs of the congregation.

At our second meeting on 3 February 2025, the following key matters were discussed:

- The Safeguarding Panel membership was confirmed.
- The Church Officer remit was agreed.
- All three Presbytery Elders from the former congregations will continue in post until the end of June. Thereafter, Maria Croall would become our Presbytery Elder. In addition, Bill Johnston has agreed to be an equalising elder.
- The new remit for the Secretary/Administrator post was agreed. Anne Turner, who has diligently served as Secretary of St Margaret's for 35 years, indicated that she would prefer to stand down, but agreed to continue until the new Administrator was appointed.
- It was agreed that the Basis of Team Ministry be reviewed as it was felt the present document did not reflect the wishes of Session. It was noted that this would cause some delay in establishing a Nominating Committee to find a second Minister.
- It was noted that Catriona Blackwood, Joan Scott and Val McIntosh had agreed to be on the Pastoral Care Team and to act as points of contact for volunteers.
- Banking and book keeping arrangements for the new congregation were agreed, and Jean Aldred was appointed Gift Aid Convener. Tracy Coyle agreed to help Mark with merging the accounts of the former congregations. Mark, Tracy and Jean would form the Finance Team, though other members may be asked to join.
- It was agreed to seek approval from Presbytery to lease the Leith St Andrew's building to Leith St Andrew's Trust for 18 months to give them time to find enough funding to buy the building, which they hope to turn into a community health, well-being and arts centre.

- It was agreed to establish the following teams, and seek members and volunteers for these: Worship, Communications, Fellowship, Education (Adult and Children), Outreach and Eco. Stewardship would come under the Finance Team.
- It was agreed how data would be stored and accessed digitally, and that a new GDPR policy would have to be drafted.
- John Innes was thanked for all his hard work in setting up the new audio-visual equipment in church.
- It was agreed that the sanctuary at LARCH Restalrig could be hired out. This would be done via the Minister.

As time goes on, and new systems and teams are established, it is hoped that the Session agenda will be a little less crammed.

On a personal note, I am delighted to have been appointed as your Session Clerk and I hope to get to know as many of you as I can. I also have to thank Shona Skakle as my trusty depute and the members of Session for all their hard work and commitment. It means such a lot.

With an uplift in the collective property portfolio as a result of the union and with somewhere in the region of 12 buildings to maintain, including all hall lets & management, even between all of us on the team, this will present quite a task!

Whilst there are numerous ongoing matters that the team are currently dealing with, a flavour of some of the stand out issues recently dealt with by us are as follows:

• Storm damage to LARCH Easter Road - Steeple requiring rope access to reconnect the lightning conductor.

- Storm damage to LARCH Restalrig Church Various slates needed replaced.
- Storm damage to LARCH Easter Road Lochend Rd Manse Roof ridge had completely blown off.
- Burst pipes McLaren Halls ladies toilet causing flooding.
- Burst boiler LARCH Restalrig Church office causing flooding.
- Burst pipes LARCH Leith Walk boiler causing flooding.
- Replacement boiler LARCH Restalrig Manse after complete breakdown.
- Pigeon infestation Bell tower LARCH Leith Walk.

Dealing with all these emergency matters has all come at a busy time of the year for property when all the schedules and associated documentation need to be submitted to Presbytery for examination on 18th March 2025.

From the Treasurer:

For those that don't know me my name is Mark Wexelstein and I have been appointed as treasurer for LARCH. I was treasurer at the former Pilrig St. Paul's from 2006 until 2024.

There is a lot of work to do over the next year in order to bring the finances of the three previous congregations together so some things may take longer than others but I along with the Finance Committee will keep the Session and the congregation up to date with the progress.

The first change is having a bank account for Leith and Restalrig Church. As the charity number we retained was the Leith St. Andrew's one it makes sense to keep that bank account as well. The name has been changed and is now Leith and Restalrig Church of Scotland. The sort code is 80-02-71 and the account number is 00224978.

If you were a member of Pilrig St. Paul's or St. Margaret's Restalrig and pay your offering by standing order can you amend the bank account details the payment is made to so your payments go into the new account. If required I have standing order mandates printed off with the new bank details that you can complete and send to your bank. (Remember to tell them to cancel the current one you have). If you want one, I will have them with me each Sunday. If you were a member of Leith St. Andrew's you don't need to change your standing order as the name change to the account won't affect the payment.

If you are interested in paying your offering by standing order you can use the details above to set this up or come and speak to me.

At present we don't need to get a new gift aid declaration signed if you have signed one for any of the three previous congregations. Over time we will ask people to sign one for the new congregation so we can make sure we have all the required forms. If you pay income tax and haven't signed a gift aid form please consider this as we can claim back an additional 25% of any donation you make and all we need is a signed form. Again if you would like more information speak to myself or Jean Aldred. We also have a PayPal account setup and we have already received donations through this from people watching online. We will look into what we can do to make this easier for people to get the required information.

I will try and put something in each magazine. Let me know if there is anything you would be interested in seeing included regarding the finances.





February's chosen book was "The No. 1 Ladies Detective Agency" by Alexander McCall Smith. Published in 1998, this book was the first of a series of novels about Precious Ramotswe, who set up the first female detective agency in Botswana.

Precious becomes very successful, solving cases of wayward daughters, missing husbands, philandering partners, conmen and finding a missing child.
