Dear Friends

I'm writing this in the middle of May. The sun and has shone, the sky has been blue, the air has been warm now for most of the last fortnight. It's a time for getting out and about, or at least feeling positive about the long, bright days, after the usual long, dark Scottish winter. We are lucky with our climate here, of course, even though we often complain about it. It's too cold for most serious diseases and dangerous mosquitos to thrive. We don't have gigantic spiders or venomous snakes sidling up our garden paths. And we have an abundance of water and good soil for grass to grow and crops to spread out. Climate change might occasionally affect us, with an increase in recent years of floods and storms, and that can cause chaos for people who live in the wrong town at the wrong time, but by and large we barely notice the small, incremental increase in the average temperature year by year.

That's not the case in many parts of the world where climate change is already producing devastating effects, drying up previously fertile soil, flooding out farms that never used to have such problems, and leaving entire communities without water and without any way of making enough money to provide the most basic food and clothing for their families. It's the poorest parts of the world that are suffering the most even though climate change is happening because the richest economies of the world refuse to take even their own environmental targets seriously.

Some deny climate change even exists. They know it exists, of course, but choose not to bother with the evidence. They know it will cause them inconvenience and will hit their massive bank balances, which they care about far more about than starving children thousands of miles away. These narcissistic liars also do not care that God has made each one of us to take care of



creation, of which we are a small part. They are more than happy to see an ecologically-aware Christianity being marginalised and largely silenced when it comes to public discourse. And they

appeal to people's inward-looking selfishness, as if selfishness has now become a virtue!

This summer, I hope we can all reflect on how we can take better care of the world's resources, how we can shop with greater awareness of environmental impact, and how we can put pressure on governments and corporate bodies – non-violently, of course – to meet the targets they blithely call 'unrealistic' (even though they set them, and know they are necessary). It's not just about maintaining a world for our children and grandchildren. It's about helping many of the poorest people in the world to survive in the here and now. It's about responding to God's call to care for the world with a display of authentic, basic Christianity.

LEITH AND RESTALRIG CHURCH - KIRK SESSION

Things have continued apace since our last article for the Magazine. The following key matters have been approved/carried out:

- The bank account name has been changed to Leith and Restalrig Church of Scotland. You will hear from Mark, our Treasurer, in due course if you require to do anything. Meantime, arrangements are as before. (see page 16)
- Pest control works for the Clock Tower at LARCH Leith Walk following an infestation by pigeons were carried out.
- The following Teams were established and have begun to work on their remits: Pastoral Care, Worship, Comms and Fellowship.
- The sound system was inspected by a sound engineer and various adjustments were made. We are still due to replace two of the speakers at the front which will hopefully make things even better.
- The Clavinova (digital piano) was transferred from Leith St Andrew's to LARCH Restalrig which has been greatly appreciated by Stuart and Ginny. The previous Clavinova is now available for use in the McLaren Halls.
- Our records were inspected by Presbytery and, apart from a couple of small points, were found to be satisfactory.
- Two stalls were booked for Leith Gala Day on Saturday 14 June. One will be an information stall and one will be a tombola stall which will raise money for our 'charity of the year', the Ripple Project. Please see the article about this in this magazine.
- Various property repairs were approved including a rewire of the Restalrig Manse and repairs to the heating system at Leith Walk.
- The budgeted deficit was discussed and several decisions were taken to ameliorate the situation, including preparing the Restalrig and Pilrig manses for renting out, moving the Restalrig office from 176 Restalrig Road South to the McLaren Halls and converting the previous office to a flat which would

- be rented out. The foodbank store will be moved to the room behind the stage.
- A letter was distributed to all members of the congregation regarding Pastoral Care.
- Following a meeting with representatives of Presbytery, and further advice from the Law Department at 121, we are now in the process of negotiating the lease of Leith St Andrew's to the Leith St Andrew's Trust.

In addition, we are pleased to welcome formally two new additions to LARCH:

 Our new Administrator, Angie Egan, has commenced working for us. She has met with Anne Turner who will continue in post till the end of May to allow for a smooth transition. Angie's hours are Mondays from 8.30am to 4.30 pm at the Leith Walk office, and Wednesdays and Thursdays from 8.30am to 12.30pm at the Restalrig office.

We have recently appointed our new Youth and Family Worker (subject to the usual reference checks) whom we hope will be able to start within the next month or so. More information to follow soon.

Both come with bags of experience in their fields, and we look forward to working with them.

LARCH PROPERTY TEAM PROPERTY NEWSLETTER - MAY 2025

Hello everyone,

In this newsletter, the property team would like to take the opportunity to let you know what we have been up to since the last time.

There has been a flurry of repairs and annual maintenance carried out across the various Larch buildings which are all either in hand or complete. It has been a bit non-stop getting all the necessary repairs completed and relevant paperwork signed off to comply with legislation.

A few things that are noteworthy, however, involve the McLaren Halls which have been assessed in terms of Fire Risk safety, insurance & security matters. This involved a review of the property by Forth Fire & Protection regarding installation of a fire alarm, an updated Fire evacuation plan and associated signage. The security of the building was also assessed by the Property Team. To control the number of keys in circulation for access & minimise the number of keys required, a locksmith company was sourced to offer advice. The result of this will involve the replacement of the locks at the main door, side fire exit door and side gate including internal rooms (excluding halls, kitchen & internal cupboards).

This replacement will take place during the closed holiday period and only those groups / nominated leaders with a specific role or requirement to access the halls will be issued with a key. The Property Team will be in contact with those groups / leaders in due course.

Larch Leith had experienced a pigeon infestation in the bell tower which required specialist assistance to remove and clean. It was a big job which was conducted recently and the matter rectified. The proposed lease of the Leith St Andrew's building to the Leith St Andrew's Trust is still ongoing.

The Manse at Moira Terrace (Formerly St Margaret's Manse) had experienced vandalism to a Laburnum tree in the rear garden after Rev John Wells had recently moved out. This had involved a trunk being sawn off with a chainsaw and additional damage to nearby branches. A tree surgeon was called in to limit further damage and the matter reported to the Police.

FROM THE TREASURER

Thank you to all the people who pay their offerings by standing order and have changed the account details with their bank to the new bank account. If your payment went to the bank accounts of either Pilrig St. Paul's or St. Margaret's and you haven't already changed the account on the standing order, can you please change the details. The account name is Leith and Restalrig Church Of Scotland. Sort code is 80-02-71 and the account number 00224978.

If you were at the stated Annual Meeting you will know the budget for the year projected a deficit of £71,000. The Finance Committee and the Kirk Session are looking at this to see what options we have to try and reduce this before the end of the year. One of the ways we can generate more income is by claiming gift aid on regular offerings or donations made. If you pay income tax we can claim back an extra 25% and all we require from you is a signed form and we will do the rest. If you pay by standing order and we have the signed form we will match these up. If you put your offering in the plate then I can provide you with an envelope that has a number on it and we use the number to match the offering with the person. Only myself and the Gift Aid Convener will know the payments you make. We will be arranging for new forms to be signed over the next few months. Thank you to the people who have asked me for envelopes over the last month.


The Sacrament of Holy Communion
